Context



- 90% young
- Structural marginalisations: identity, spatial, infrastructure, cultural
- Shifting social, economic and political contracts
- Viewed as:
 - labour force that can propel economic growth
 - troubled group that must be restrained
- Limited conversation on what works, what are young people driving

Centring the urban



- Formal and substantive citizenship in cities (Holston&Appadurai, 1996)
- Intersecting challenges –
 labour, climate, health, digital
- The 'relational' in cities is dynamic and evolving
- Youth coping and thriving
- Ethical partnership with adults can add huge value

Centring young people



- Meaningful participation: why, when, how
- Participation as representation
- Ethics of research can be 'messy'
- Consider tokenism, power, intergenerationality, capacities...
- Dynamics of diverse collaborations
